Ask About Rapid HIV Medications

People live longer, healthier lives when they start HIV medications as soon as possible. Ask your healthcare team if rapid HIV medications are available at time of diagnosis.

Educate Yourself

Start educating yourself. A wealth of information is available online, but it's a good idea to consult sources you can trust, including the Tarrant County HIV Administrative Agency website, **BeatHIVTC.org**

Be Safe

Keep yourself safe. Don't have unprotected sex. Don't share needles. Avoid exchanging blood, semen, vaginal fluid, anal fluid or breast milk.

Find Trusted Support
