Black Women & HIV in Texas

• 56% of all new HIV infections in women are Black women, despite accounting for 13% of the female population in Texas (Texas Health and Human Services, 2023; US Census Bureau)

From 2019-2022,
 Black people had an average PrEP
 coverage of 10.3% (Odii et al., 2024)















The Beauty Shop Study



Phase 1: Building Community

- Identifying key community health advocates
- Needs assessment: survey and focus groups
- Preparing for rollout: what do we need to keep in mind?

Phase 2: Service Delivery

- Services on the MHU and/or referral coordination
- Women's health: pap smears, breast cancer screenings
- HIV and STI testing
- PrEP referrals

Phase 3: Gathering Feedback

- What went well?
- What needs improvement for next time?

















TCU Purpose of the Beauty Shop Study

Leveraging trusted community members to engage women in sexual health conversations

Provide healthcare services and referrals to HIV testing, PrEP prescriptions, and women's health services















Why this work is important

 To end the HIV epidemic, research needs to focus on populations that are being affected the most Increasing education and eliminating barriers are important first steps to increasing HIV testing and PrEP use (Arnold et al., 2022)
